### **Our History**

NINOS, Inc. (Neighbors In Need Of Services, Inc.) is a Head Start and Early Head Start program that serves families and young children in the Rio Grande Valley of Texas. Established in 1990, NINOS, Inc. was founded to address the needs of low-income families by providing comprehensive early childhood education services, including health, nutrition, and family support. The program is designed to prepare children from birth to age four for school success and lifelong learning.

NINOS, Inc. grew over the years to become one of the largest early childhood education providers in the region, expanding its reach to both Head Start (ages 3-4) and Early Head Start (ages 0-3) programs and serving two counties in the Rio Grande Valley Cameron and Willacy. Its mission is rooted in providing high-quality education, fostering social-emotional development, and empowering parents to take an active role in their children's education. By integrating various support services, including health screenings, nutrition, and developmental assessments, NINOS, Inc. plays a critical role in improving outcomes for children and families facing economic challenges.

The organization continues to work in close partnership with the community, local school districts, and other agencies, ensuring that children are well-prepared for kindergarten and that families receive the necessary support to thrive.

NINOS, Inc. Head Start and Early Head Start services area covers Cameron and Willacy county of Texas in the Rio Grande Valley. For the 2023-2024 program year the program operated in 52 centers to serve which are strategically located to serve 1270 Head Start children and 720 Early Head Start children.

### **HOW WE LEARN**

#### Curriculum

Students enrolled in the Early Head Start and Head Start programs benefit from learning opportunities enhanced by the Frog Street infant, toddler and pre-k curriculums.

- Frog Street Infant (Birth to 18 months)
   Focuses on building a strong foundation in sensory and emotional development. It includes activities for cognitive, social-emotional, physical, and language development. The curriculum is designed to foster strong caregiver-child interactions, which are essential in nurturing early brain development.
- Frog Street Toddler (18 months to 36 months) Emphasizes active exploration and discovery, with a strong focus on social-emotional development and self-regulation. It integrates language-rich experiences, early math concepts, and introduces problemsolving skills through play-based activities.
- Frog Street Pre-K (3 to 5 years) A comprehensive, research-based curriculum that prepares children for school success. It covers key areas such as language development, math, science, social studies, and creative arts. It also focuses on social-emotional learning and includes strategies for differentiated instruction.

### **Parent Curriculum**

Parents are encourage to participate in learning opportunities enhance by the Abriendo Puertas (Opening Doors) curriculum.

Abriendo Puertas (Opening Doors) designed for Latino families with children aged 0-5. It aims to empower parents as their child's first and most influential teachers, helping them promote their children's learning and development across multiple domains. The curriculum is culturally relevant and presented in Spanish and English.

#### **Assessment & Outcomes**


Students enrolled in the Early Head Start and Head Start program are assessed three times out of the year for beginning-of-year (BOY), middle-of-year (MOY) and end-of-year (EOY) assessments using the Learning Accomplishment Profile (LAP) that is a comprehensive developmental assessment tool used to measure the progress and skills of children from birth to 5 years old.

The LAP is administered through direct observation, parent reports, and structured activities, allowing educators to gather comprehensive data on a child's development. The results are used to inform instruction, tailor interventions, and track progress over time.

### **Highlights for 2023-2024 Program**

- Upon transitioning from our program to kindergarten, students consistently meet objective in all Domains and surpassed the 75% threshold goal.
- 128 children transition to Head Start from Early Head Start.
- 102 children in Head Start are projected to enter kindergarten.
- 122 parents gradationed from participating in the parent curriculum Abriendo Puertas

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### STUDENTS SPOTLIGHT

### I Am Moving, I Am Learning (IMIL)

Physical Activity and Nutrition initiative designed to promote physical activity and healthy nutrition among students enrolled in Head Start and Early Head Start programs. It was developed as a proactive response to the rising rates of childhood obesity and aims to improve health outcomes by integrating more movement and active learning into daily routines.







### **Garden to Head Start/Early Head Start**

For the 2023-2024 program a nature based learning initiative was implemented by establishing gardens at all NINOS, Inc. centers. Gardening and nutrition education was introduce to head start and early head start children and staff that provided hands-on experiences in growing, harvesting, and preparing fresh fruits and vegetables, which helps them develop a deeper understanding of where their food comes from, encourages healthy eating habits, and fosters environmental stewardship.



### **Field Trips in Head Start**

NINOS, Inc. conducted 20 field trips for the 2023-2024 program year as a chance for provide Head Start students with real-word experiences. Head Start children got to visit the following locations:

NINOS, Inc. celebrated our graduation class of 2023-2024 with graduation ceremonies to recognize the 1,012 children that graduated from the Head Start program this year who are all school ready.






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### **AGENCY SPOTLIGHT**

#### **Dollar Per Child**

NINOS Inc. was recognized on the national level as the 2023's Top Dollar Per Child program contributions per funded enrollment at the annual National Head Start Conference that was held at Portland, Oregon from April 15 to 18, 2024.

The Dollar Per Child is a fundraising initiative run by the National Head Start Association (NHSA) to raise funds to support advocacy efforts that ensures children enrolled in Head Start and Early Head Start programs continue to receive necessary resources, services, and support they need to thrive.





#### **CLASS Review**

For the 2023-2024 program NINOS, Inc. went through a CLASS Review in which observations were conducted in 42 preschool center-based classrooms from January 24 to March 11, 2024. The CLASS review focuses on three primary domains: Emotional Support, Classroom Organization, and Instructional Support to evaluate the a program's teaching effectiveness, classroom quality, compliance & accountability, and continues improvement.

NINOS, Inc. CLASS Review scores for 2024 surpassed the National Head Start Quality Threshold in all three domains, a first time for the agency since it establishment in 1990.

### **NINOS, Inc. Federal Review**



Results were provide to the agency after the review on May 22, 2024. NINOS, Inc. was found in compliance in All Areas and informed of having strong practices in the following:



## Parent Engagement

### **Parent and Family Engagement**

Families play a critical role in both Head Start and Early Head Start programs. At NINOS, Inc., the Policy Council is primarily composed of parents, empowering them to actively participate in making important decisions about their Head Start and Early Head Start programs.

The Policy Council assists in developing policies, making key decisions regarding the hiring and termination of staff, crafting the program's budget, and determining program priorities. This involvement ensures that the voices of families are heard and incorporated into the growth and development of the program.

In addition to the Policy Council, a Parent Committee is established within each area caseload. These committees are comprised of parents of currently enrolled children, and parents are regularly surveyed to determine the types of activities or workshops they are most interested in during Parent Committee meetings. This process allows parents to develop leadership skills and gain valuable experience by taking an active role in planning and developing these activities and services.

Area Managers, Family Service Workers, and teaching staff actively encourage and invite parents to volunteer in the classroom, kitchen, and office, fostering deeper engagement and building a stronger community within the program.

To promote father or father-figure involvement in their children's education and development NINOS, Inc. organizes a special event during the year the Father-Child Day at the Zoo. Fathers, grandfathers, uncles, or other male role models are encourage to participate in the event with their children for a day of bonding and fun activities at Gladys Porter Zoo in Brownsville, TX. NINOS, Inc. had 1700 participants this year for the event.

### **EDUCATION & PARTNERSHIPS**

### **Education and School Readiness**

NINOS, Inc. actively partners with families to review and assess the curriculum, ensuring parents play a key role in evaluating its effectiveness in supporting each child's development. Recognizing parents as their children's primary educators, we encourage their involvement in both the program and the community.

The curriculum prepares children for kindergarten through individualized lesson plans based on initial LAP (Learning Accomplishment Profile) screenings. It focuses on physical health, socialemotional growth, learning approaches, cognitive development in math and science, language, and literacy. English language development is prioritized for dual-language learners.

Throughout the year, children's goals are regularly updated with parental input. Ongoing LAP assessments provide data to guide continuous improvement. Infants and toddlers are prepared for school success through activities that develop essential skills, fostering confidence, curiosity, self-control, and communication.

### **2023-2024 Transitions**

Transition is a priority at Head Start. Children can't begin to learn if they are frightened or uncomfortable with their surroundings. The transition services focus on assisting and preparing parents and staff as a child leaves the comforts of home to enter the Early Head Start, Head Start or the Public School.

- A total of 102 children were projected to transitioned into kindergarten
- A total of 128 toddlers transitioned to Head Start by the end of the of the program year.

#### Collaboration

NINOS, Inc. has working relationship with (8) school district, (8) public libraries, and (2) state-chartered schools within the service area. There are written local agreements with each entity that is updated annual to collaborate in transitions, special service, Dual Enrollment, facilities, and food service.






### EOY Results by Head Start Outcomes 0-11 months 2023-2024




#### EOY Results by Head Start Outcomes 12-23 months 2023-2024




### EOY Results by Head Start Outcomes 24-35 months 2023-2024




#### EOY Results by Head Start Outcomes 3 year olds 2023-2024
